2015 BUDGET INTRODUCTION

Comments: Mayor Campbell gave a summary of the budgetary concerns for Fiscal Year 2015. The tax base has experienced a slow decline over the last decade and there has been very little offset due to a lack of construction in the borough. The local tax levy will increase by 4.2% as the tax base declined by 2.4%. Property values have declined so it is likely that both the county and Eastern Regional High School taxes will decrease this year. Focus this year will be to limit expenses and exercise a continued effort to increase ratables.

SECOND READING:

2015-01 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 222 OF THE CODE OF THE
BOROUGH OF GIBBSBORO, ENTITLED "HISTORIC PRESERVATION",
TO ADD ADDITIONAL DESIGN STANDARDS AND GUIDELINES

WHEREAS, the Planning Board of the Borough of Gibbsboro, County of Camden has adopted a Historic Preservation Element of the Master Plan providing for the preservation of historical and cultural resources in the Borough in a manner which will promote the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Gibbsboro has adopted a Historic Preservation Ordinance that created a historic district, subsequently expanded; established a Historic Preservation Commission; and developed processes, guidelines and procedures for the review of alterations to building and the physical environment within such Historic District; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Land Use Law at N.J.S.A. 40:55D-65.1 permits the regulation of historic properties including the establishment of guidelines and design standards; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board of the Borough of Gibbsboro has reviewed and recommends to the Borough Council that certain documents be adopted as references in Chapter 222 which will

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aid applicants and the Historic Preservation Commission in its duties and responsibilities in preserving the historic and cultural character of the Borough.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED and ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Gibbsboro, in the County of Camden as follows:

Section 1. §222-8 of the Historic Preservation Ordinance shall be modified by adding paragraph “D” as follows:

D. The following reference documents, as they may be amended or superseded, shall be used as design standards for the design of rehabilitation, renovation, alteration or construction work within the historic district and as review standards by the Historic Preservation Commission:

- (1) The Secretary of the Interior’s Standards for Rehabilitation and Illustrated Guidelines on Sustainability for Rehabilitating Historic Buildings, U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service, Technical Preservation Services, 2011.
- (2) Sample Guidelines for Solar Systems in Historic Districts, National Alliance of Preservation Commissions, 2011.

Section 2. Continuation, Chapter 222. In all other respects, Chapter 222 of the Code of the Borough of Gibbsboro shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. Severability. If any portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole, or any other part thereof. Any invalidation shall be confined in its operation to the section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, term, or provision or part there of directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 4. Interpretation. If the terms of this Ordinance shall be in conflict with those of another Ordinance of the Code of the Borough of Gibbsboro, then the restriction which imposes the greater limitation shall be enforced.

Section 5. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency only.

Section 6. Enactment. This Ordinance shall take effect upon the filing thereof with the Camden County Planning Board after final passage, adoption, and publication by the Borough Council of the Borough of Gibbsboro in the manner prescribed by law.

PLANNING BOARD/PUBLIC WORKS

COUNCILMAN BONSAALL

Councilman Bonsall reported that at its March meeting, the Planning Board approved a new building to be built on Lakeview Drive near the American Legion. The owners of the former Lakes Appliance building came to the Board to discuss concepts for the building's use; it was noted that the available parking limits potential uses. The Planning Board also discussed the recent court decision regarding COAH. Councilman Bonsall stated that Public Works did a great job removing snow from the roads. He also noted that the front-end loader is approximately 27 years old.

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PUBLIC EVENTS

COUNCILMAN BROWN

Councilman Brown reported that annual egg hunt will be held on Saturday, March 28 at 10 a.m. Those wishing to help should arrive by 9:15 a.m. Rain date is April 4.

POLICE/LIBRARY

TRASH/RECYCLING

COUNCILMAN DETERDING

Councilman Deterding reported that 54 tons of trash was collected last month. In January, 19.86 tons of recycling was collected and a rebate of \$35 was received.

Councilman MacFerren reported that the bids for the installation of the new Lauer Playground equipment will be discussed under New Business. For L&I, \$2,127 was collected last month for permits. The Construction office is using the recently purchased software program.

INSURANCE/ENVIRONMENTAL

COUNCILMAN FLYNN

Councilman Flynn reported that there are no current insurance claims. The Environmental Commission/Green Team is submitting and planning actions to obtain Sustainable Jersey certification. A tree hazard inventory will be taken in the Spring and a community shredding day is being considered. A Clean Up day will be held on April 25th. The Environmental Commission also has drafted an essay question for the Miss Gibbsboro Pageant regarding sustainability.

MAYOR'S REPORT

MAYOR CAMPBELL

Mayor Campbell reported that the courts are now hearing Affordable Housing issues as COAH has been deemed non-functional. The Planning Board will be holding a public hearing about the Redevelopment Plan on April 14. As it is important for the Council to act on the Planning Board's recommendation, the Mayor proposes changing the date of the next Council meeting to April 15, 2015. The Mayor met with two Gibbsboro property owners who were interested in selling their properties to the Borough. One is a wooded property located on 561 toward Pole Hill Park on the Voorhees border with a steep slope. The second property is the land by the Berlin Road cul-de-sac which borders Gibbsboro's open space. If sought, the Borough would pay for a certified appraisal and a fair market value would be determined. Seventy-five percent of the funds could be covered by Green Acres and the County. After presentation to the Council, the Council stated it is not interested in purchasing either property.
