PUBLIC HEARING ON THE 2015 BUDGET

Mayor Campbell commented that the tax rate will go from \$1.094 to \$1.138 which is a \$0.044 increase per \$100 or 3.89% that is largely due to a drop in the tax base due to demolished office buildings. The tax base dropped \$4 million or 2.46%. The Council is only raising expenses by a very small amount and significantly less than it is permitted by the cap law. The collection rate for the Borough in 2014 was 99.66% which is one of the best in the State.

STATE FISCAL YEAR 2015 AN ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 1.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14 provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Gibbsboro in the County of Camden finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2015 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that a 3% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$43,530.42 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Gibbsboro, in the County of Camden, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2015 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Gibbsboro shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$76,178.24, and that the CY 2015 municipal budget for the Borough of Gibbsboro be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

2015-4-56 RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF GIBBSBORO CALLING FOR THE
LEGISLATURE AND THE ADMINISTRATION TO ADOPT A NEW, MORE
SENSIBLE APPROACH TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING

WHEREAS, on September 26, 2013, the New Jersey Supreme Court decision In re Adoption of N.J.A.C. 5:96 & 5:97 by N.J. Council on Affordable Housing, 215 N.J. 578 (2013) invalidated the round three regulations adopted by the Council on Affordable Housing (COAH) in 2008 and charged COAH with the responsibility of adopting a third iteration of round three regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court also invited the Legislature and the Governor, to devise a new legislative-based approach to affordable housing in our State and promised to show enormous deference to any new legislative pronouncement; and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court extended the five month deadline it established in In re Adoption Of N.J.A.C. 5:96 and 5:97 and set May 1, 2014 as the deadline for COAH to propose new round three regulations, and October 22, 2014 as the deadline for COAH to adopt new round three regulations; and

WHEREAS, on October 20, 2014 the COAH Board met and were unable to adopt new regulations due to a 3-3 vote, creating more uncertainty and turmoil for municipalities; and

WHEREAS, on January 6, 2015 the New Jersey Supreme Court heard argument in a motion brought forth by the Fair Share Housing Center asking the Court to strip COAH of its authority and return implementation of the Fair Housing Act to the Court, thereby potentially exposing municipalities to costly litigation; and

WHEREAS, the confusion and uncertainty that has resulted from costly court actions, prolonged litigation and the lack of reasonable guidance demonstrates the need for a new State housing policy based on good planning which incentivizes participation and the provision of additional affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature and Governor should seize this opportunity to reform the State's housing laws and implement a statewide housing plan predicated on good planning which provides incentives and directs funding to assist municipalities and to protect the interests of taxpayers.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Gibbsboro that we urge the Governor and the State Legislature to partner with municipalities and enact legislation to implement a reasonable and rational state affordable housing policy which promotes rational planning, seeks to achieve results with available housing funding and incentives, encourages partnerships and protects the interests of taxpayers; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this Resolution be forwarded to the Governor and Lieutenant Governor of New Jersey, the Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs, State Senator Beach, Assemblyman Louis Greenwald, Assemblywoman Pamela Lampitt, the President of the New Jersey State Senate, the Speaker of the New Jersey General Assembly and the New Jersey State League of Municipalities

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board, and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the promulgations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52 - to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52 - "A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the Director of Local Government Services, under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than \$1,000 or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office."

2015-4-55 A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF GIBBSBORO ACCEPTING AND ADOPTING RESOLUTION NO. 2015PB-4-09 OF THE GIBBSBORO BOROUGH PLANNING BOARD AND DECLARING BLOCK 8.02, LOTS 3.01 AND 5, AND BLOCK 8.03, LOTS 6.01, 6.02, 6.03, 6.05, PART OF 6.06 AND 6.10 BE DESIGNATED AS AN AREA IN NEED OF REDEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1, et. seq., (“LRHL”), the Borough Council of Gibbsboro Borough (the “Council”) directed the Planning Board of the Borough of Gibbsboro to conduct a preliminary investigation to determine whether Block 8,02, Lots 3.01 and 5 and Block 8.03, Lots 6.01, 6.02, 6.03, 6.04, 6.05, part of 6.06 and 6.10, (hereinafter the “Paintworks Redevelopment Expansion Study Area”), constitutes a Redevelopment Area in accordance with some or all of the criteria set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5; and,

WHEREAS, on April 14, 2015, the Gibbsboro Borough Planning Board considered the matter during a public hearing and discussed and conducted a preliminary investigation of the Paintworks Redevelopment Expansion Study Area, and at said public hearing, the Planning Board made certain findings and recommended to the Governing Body that the Paintworks Redevelopment Expansion Study Area be designated as an “Area in Need of Redevelopment” pursuant to the LRHL; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning Board further considered the Preliminary Investigation Report prepared by the Borough Planning Brian Slauch, PP, AICP, dated March 10, 2015, which concluded that the conditions of the Paintworks Redevelopment Expansion Study Area qualify as an “Area in Need of Redevelopment” as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Gibbsboro as follows

1. The Council hereby accepts the findings and recommendations of the Gibbsboro Borough Planning Board as memorialized in Resolution No. 2015PB-4-09 of the Gibbsboro Borough Planning Board adopted on April 14, 2015; and,

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- 2. The Council hereby designates Block 8.02, Lots 3.01 and 5; and Block 8.03, Lots 6.01, 6.02, 6.03, 6.05, part of 6.06 and 6.10, as an "Area in Need of Redevelopment" as defined by the LRHL, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1, et. seq.

Meeting Open to the Public for comment on above resolution

Karista and John Schwarz of 65 United States Avenue objected to portions of their property (all of Block 8.03, Lot 6.10 and a portion of Lot 6.06) being included in the redevelopment area as they contend that the properties do not meet the criteria. As presented at the Planning Board last night, their property is being included in the area to make the use of the other lots more feasible. They requested that their properties be excluded. Ms. Schwarz believes that if their lots were excluded that the project could still be built. It was explained to the Schwarz's that this is the starting point of the investigatory process by the Council.

Kathleen Robbins of 15 Marlton Avenue questioned the redevelopment area and the effect on zoning. Councilman Bonsall pointed out that the resolution is to expand the current redevelopment zone. The legal requirement of public advertising was questioned and explained. Solicitor Jehl provided background regarding the State's Affordable Housing and the need for the borough to start investigating possible areas so that the courts do not permit builders to control the process.

Jayesh Patel of 47 S. Lakeview Avenue asked about the timing of this process. He seeks a better understanding so that he can provide information to his tenant. Engineer Fusco explained that the declaration of the redevelopment area expansion allows the borough to do its investigation. If actual development were to proceed, business and property owners would enter into negotiations with the borough. Councilman Bonsall stated that unfortunately no time line can be offered.

COUNCILMAN FLYNN

Councilman Flynn stated that no claims or injuries were reported. The Joint Insurance Fund has recognized the borough for its safety program and for having no lost time due to injuries for the

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second year in a row. JIF will be presenting the borough with a monetary award. A Gibbsboro Clean-Up Day is scheduled for April 25, 2015. The Environmental Commission is interested in working with the Girl Scouts regarding additional bike signs. A butterfly garden has been started with the school. The tree hazard inventory will soon begin.

MAYOR’S REPORT

MAYOR CAMPBELL

Mayor Campbell reported that the NJ Department of Transportation will be providing a \$201,000 grant to overlay Farwood Road. The engineer is going to look into Farwood Road’s stormwater drainage. Quotes will soon be solicited for signs to be posted on the three brick foundations located at the Lucas Homestead, Lucas Park and the entrance of Hidden Woods. A conference call with the EPA and its contractor was held this morning to kick off the Technical Assistance Service for Communities (TASC).
