This work will involve:

Installation of stream monitoring gauges along Hilliards Creek and its tributaries at ten locations in Gibbsboro and Voorhees.

During this timeframe, you may see our project team installing equipment along the waterways. We have obtained access agreements from the appropriate property owners for this work. As with previous activities, we will make every effort possible to minimize disruptions to the neighborhood.

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The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has selected a Final Remedy and issued a Record of Decision to remediate soils on certain residential properties located in Gibbsboro and Voorhees, New Jersey. Sherwin-Williams is proceeding with the **Pre-Design Activities** required to inform the remediation design and prepare contract specifications. This fact sheet provides detailed information on the activity scheduled to occur on your property.

Current Activity: Geophysical Survey

A geophysical survey is performed during the pre-design phase to identify utilities and other subsurface structures on a property. This non-intrusive process will locate active utilities as well as inactive and historic obstructions that may be located below ground. A geophysical survey is an important safety step in the remedial design process.

The geophysical survey will typically be performed at the same time as delineation sampling. Property owners who have signed an access agreement will be contacted by a project team representative to schedule this work.
