An Important Message regarding Mail Service from Postmaster Joseph E. Tadley

Effective June 16 the letter carriers currently working out of the Gibbsboro Post Office will begin working out of the Voorhees Post Office. The Voorhees office is located approximately 2 miles from the Gibbsboro office. For the most part, this change will be transparent to our customers and will in no way impact either delivery or retail service. Customers will likely notice little or no change in their home or business delivery service. When the change is implemented, it is possible that some customers' mail may be delivered a few minutes later.

If a customer has a "Left Notice" article (a certified letter or package that requires a signature), they can retrieve that item at the Gibbsboro Post Office the following day like they do now. The window service at the Gibbsboro Post Office will not be affected by this change. We will continue to provide customers at the Gibbsboro Post Office with retail, PO Box, and mail acceptance services.
