### **Library News**

***Graphic Novels Now on Shelves*** - Gibbsboro Library now has more than 200 new graphic novels thanks to a \$3,000 grant awarded last fall from the New Jersey State Library to establish a graphic novel collection. Funding for this grant was made possible through the Florence Taylor Tischler and Nathaniel Tischler Memorial Fund.

The Library used the grant to develop a core collection of graphic novels for teens and children. Graphic novels are original literary works combining illustrations and words in the tradition of comic books, and are popular with all age groups. While many of the books feature familiar characters like Spiderman, Transformers and Scooby-Doo, there are many new ones for readers to enjoy including Bone, Polo, Fashion Kitty and Babymouse. There are a wide variety of books, both non-fiction and fiction, as well as classic novels and Shakespearean works that all age levels can enjoy.

***Music CD Collection Added this Summer-*** More than 50 music CDs, spanning all musical genres from Broadway show favorites to Bruce Springsteen, are now part of a browsing CD collection at the Library. The Library purchased the CDs with a \$575 grant from the NJ State Library through the Compact Disc Anti-trust Settlement Grant Program. CDs, like DVDs, can be borrowed for 1 week, and up to three can be checked out at a time. The overdue fine for both CDs and DVDs is \$1 per day per CD/DVD with a \$5 maximum fine.

***DVDs Donated to Library -*** A great selection of newer children's DVDs, many of which are Walt Disney movies, has been donated to the Library. Most of the movies can be found on the spinner in the children's room.
