## **2013 BUDGET INTRODUCTION:**

#### Comments

Mayor Campbell commented that 2012 ended with a paper balance of \$1,102,675.62. A significant amount of that is being used for the 2013 budget. The 2013 budget starts \$80,000 in the hole. The appropriation reserves will lapse at the end of the 2013 and will be available January 1, 2014. The reserve has fallen approximately \$53,000 which means a smaller fund balance and smaller appropriation reserves. The amount to be raised by taxation is going up by approximately \$67,000. The assessed tax base fell by .93%.
