PET NEWS AND ETIQUETTE

Dog and Cat License/Renewal due July 31

ALL dogs and cats must be licensed within Gibbsboro. This includes any pet kept outside.

Licenses may be obtained at the rabies clinic or from Borough Hall. Rabies clinics are open to all pet owners regardless of residences – attend another town's clinic if you have a conflict.

If your pet is not licensed it will be required at the clinic.

Late fees apply after July 31.

To license your dog or cat, use the enclosed registration form.

The State of New Jersey and Borough require all dogs to be leashed at all times. It is illegal to allow dogs to run free in parks or open areas.

You are required to clean up after your dog on all private and public property.



Take Note: Don't Feed the Waterfowl!

Chapter § 96-18 **Feeding prohibited.** It shall be unlawful for any person to feed, cause to be fed, or provide food for wild water fowl or to create any condition or allow any condition to exist which results in a threat to the health, safety or welfare of wild water fowl and migratory water fowl.

Minimum Fine: \$100.

1. Enclose check or money order payable to: Borough of Gibbsboro.

Per Dog/Cat (includes State fees) \$ 17.00

Additional Fees: Non-neutered/Non-spayed Dogs/Cats \$ 3.00

Late Fee* (for payments after July 31) \$ 25.00

2. Enclose current rabies certificate and proof of neutering or spaying.
3. Enclose Veterinarian's certificate stating your dog/cat has been neutered or spayed. If you do not have a certificate, add three dollars (\$3.00) to the cost of the license.
4. Complete and return application to Borough of Gibbsboro, 49 Kirkwood Road, Gibbsboro, NJ 08026 with certificates for rabies inoculation and evidence of spay/neutering. **
5. If mailing payment, enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope.

If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label for guidance.

Use natural or less toxic alternatives when possible.

Recycle used motor oil.

Contact your municipality, county or facility management office for the locations of hazardous-waste disposal facilities.

Clean up after your pet

Many municipalities and public agencies must enact and enforce local pet-waste rules.

An example is requiring pet owners or their keepers to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property.

Make sure you know your town's or agency's requirements and comply with them. It's the law. And remember to:

Use newspaper, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up wastes.



Dispose of yard waste properly

Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains.

If your municipality or agency has yard waste collection rules, follow them.

Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost. Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.



Keep pollution out of storm drains

Municipalities and many other public agencies are required to mark certain storm drain inlets with messages reminding people that storm drains are connected to local waterbodies.

Do not let sewage or other wastes flow into a stormwater system.

Don't feed wildlife

Do not feed wildlife, such as ducks and geese, in public areas.

Many municipalities and other public agencies must enact and enforce a rule that prohibits wildlife feeding in these areas.

Don't litter

Place litter in trash receptacles.

Recycle. Recycle. Recycle.

Participate in community cleanups.




