

Planning and Zoning Board Approvals

March: Final major site plan approval and a certificate of appropriateness were granted to **Jane's Joint Boutique Dispensary LLC** to operate a Class 5 Cannabis Retail Dispensary at 142 South Lakeview Drive.

A Use Variance was granted to the **Voorhees Township Board of Education** to operate a Pre-Kindergarten at 250 Haddonfield-Berlin Road in Gibbsboro.

April: A conditional use variance and minor site plan approval was granted to **Boutique Gardens LLC** to operate a class 2 cannabis manufacturing business at 10 Democrat Way.



NJ Cannabis Regulatory Commission (CRC) Approves One Green Leaf, LLC to Open!

One Green Leaf is the first dispensary to receive permission to open in Gibbsboro. The property owner, Sonraj LLC, purchased and rehabilitated several distressed properties along North Lakeview Drive. In addition to property taxes, the business will pay the Borough a tax of two (2) per cent of all revenues. The new cannabis tax is payable quarterly.

Congressionally-Directed Spending (CDS) Economic Development Initiative Community Project Funding (CPF)

In the most recent federal budget appropriations bill, Gibbsboro was awarded **\$750K** as a dedicated line item in the HUD budget to aid in the renovation of the former home of John Lucas as a Community Events Venue. The funding was made possible thanks to the support of US Senator Cory Booker and Congressman Donald Norcross who specifically incorporated the grant into the federal budget. The project will complement planned major redevelopment at the Paintworks. Work is expected to be completed within two years. CDS is more commonly known as budget earmarks.

NJ Department of Transportation Local Freight Impact Fund

NJ DOT recently announced a **\$570K** award to Gibbsboro for improvements to Old Egg Harbor Road from East Clementon Road to the Voorhees Township border. The grant will fund roadway and intersection work to improve safety for residents, pedestrians and bikers that use the road. Some high school students use the road as a short-cut to walk to Eastern High School. The deadend road is also used by large trucks that transport cargo to and from a Voorhees Township business.

Recycling Tonnage Grant

The Borough received and appropriated **\$3,928.98**, which represents a stipend from the state based upon 2021 recycling efforts.

NJ DMV Funds

The Borough received and appropriated **\$1,950** from the state based upon DMV inspection fees collected in Gibbsboro.



New Trail Opens to Public

Constructed by Sevenson, and paid for by Sherwin-Williams, the Borough's newest trail segment opened last week for public use. The trail connects the Yellow Trail to Marlton Avenue at Berlin Road. It runs across the US Avenue Burn Site, crosses Honey Run, and weaves along the White Sands Branch connecting to an existing trail segment along Berlin Road. The trail was constructed for the Borough as part of a Community Benefits Agreement between Sherwin-Williams and the Borough.



Sherwin-Williams Remediation Project Update

The Sherwin-Williams Company is working with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to investigate and remediate environmental conditions associated with past industrial operations at the former Sherwin-Williams paint manufacturing plant in Gibbsboro. Activities at the three Superfund sites (Sherwin-Williams/ Hilliards Creek Site, the Route 561 Dump Site and the United States Avenue Burn Site) have been divided into six units to help facilitate the remedy decision and remedial action process.

The Residential Properties unit remediation is complete.


The Route 561 Dump Site Soils unit remediation is complete.

United States Avenue Burn Site unit remediation is complete.

Waterbodies including Hilliards Creek – The Waterbodies unit addresses contaminated sediments and floodplain soils in Silver Lake, Bridgewood Lake, Kirkwood Lake and Hilliards Creek. The Sherwin-Williams team has initiated Pre-Design Investigations (PDI) of Silver Lake and Bridgewood Lake in Gibbsboro. Once the PDI phase is complete for each lake, the team will move forward with remedial design.

Former Manufacturing Plant (FMP) Groundwater - Sherwin-Williams is working with EPA to finalize the Remedial Investigation (RI) of the Groundwater unit. Once the RI is approved by EPA, Sherwin-Williams will proceed with the Feasibility Study to evaluate alternatives for addressing groundwater contamination at the FMP.

FMP Soils - The FMP unit includes parcels at the base of Silver Lake north of Foster Avenue, parcels south of Avenue, and Foster segment of Hilliards Creek between Foster Avenue and West Clementon Road. The first area to be remediated included two parcels (red area) on the eastern side of smokestacks along United States Avenue, Work is now transitioning to the remaining area north Foster Avenue and west of the former warehouses that were demolished in 2023 (grey area). This will include the 6 E. Clementon Road



"slab". The remediation requires Silver Lake to be lowered and the dam to be reinforced as the excavations will be very deep. The boardwalk area of the path around Silver Lake will be closed for the balance of 2024 and we anticipate Foster Avenue being closed for a period of time.
