

Rising Costs Continue to Stress Budgets

2025

Police Pension Costs – Increased by 26% for the current year while pension costs for non-Police & Fire employees grew at 10%. Police pension costs have grown by more than 800% since 2008!

Courtesy Busing – The Borough provides this service for Eastern High School students in grades 9-11. The cost increased by nearly 40% for the current school year.

EMS Service – This service was previously provided by Voorhees at no cost to taxpayers. A 2025, five-year agreement calls for an annual payment of approximately \$53K for this essential service.

2026

Employee Health Insurance - Costs continue to rise with premiums for the new year set to increase by 26%.

Trash & Recycling Collection – The Borough approved a one-year contract with Suburban Disposal that resulted in a 161% increase in trash collection costs and 66% for recycling over the prior year.

TRASH COLLECTION/RECYCLING REMINDERS

<u>Weight:</u> Trash cans and bulk items like chairs and sofas *cannot weigh more than forty* (40) *pounds*.

<u>Branches:</u> must be tied in bundles no more than three (3) feet long and **weigh less than forty (40) pounds**.

<u>Paint:</u> MUST be dried or mixed with saw dust or sand to solidify. NEVER place liquid paint in the trash without processing it - <u>you</u> may be liable for damage to the trash collection vehicle!

<u>Construction Debris/Roofing Material</u>: The Borough does not provide collection for such items – use a private dumpster.

White Goods: Refrigerators, washers, and dryers are collected on the last Friday of the month. Remove doors to ensure children cannot get trapped inside and call Public Works (856) 783-6655 X170 to let them know you have an item for pick-up.

<u>Non-recyclables</u>: Pizza boxes, aluminum foil, plate glass, light bulbs, plastic wrap, and mixed items (e.g. an aluminum lawn chair with plastic lacing, motors) should be disposed of in the trash.

<u>Household Hazardous Waste Collection</u>: The Borough does not collect these items. Camden County sponsors monthly collection events in the spring and summer.

<u>Electronics/TVs</u>: The Borough does not collect these items. Retailers that sell electronics are required to accept them. Also, Goodwill will accept electronics for recycling.

<u>Holidays</u>: If a recognized holiday (New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day) falls during the week, trash and recyclables will be collected on Thursday. Register for NIXLE, <u>www.nixle.com</u>, to be "in the know".

<u>Timing</u>: Place trash and recyclables curbside Tuesday night, not Wednesday morning. Put lids on trash cans to deter animals.

New Jersey Budget to Fund Senior Center Addition

The State Fiscal Year 2026 budget includes a line item granting \$400,000 to Gibbsboro to supplement a planned addition to the Senior Center at Pole Hill Park. The funding supplements a prior year DCA grant for \$71,000. Construction is expected to begin in the late spring.

Land Use News

Site Plan Approval: Gibbsboro Green Energy received approval to add a convenience store and parking to the existing gas station opposite Wawa. An application for a Certificate of Appropriateness for façade upgrades will be heard at the December meeting of the Planning Board.

Site Plan Waiver with Variances: A waiver of Site Plan with conditions was granted at the November Planning Board meeting to Romany Beshay for Hanna Sons LLC to make façade and site improvements at an industrial building at 1 West Road (Block 69.02 Lots 8,9,17.01,17.02 & 18, Block 90.01 Lot 1).


SUPERFUND UPDATE

Silver Lake: The remediation of Silver Lake is now complete, and all sediments have been removed from the lakebed. Repairs to the dam are also complete and the lake is naturally refilling to previous levels. Fish restocking will take place in the spring.

Next Phase: Work is underway on the U.S. Avenue South unit. Construction vehicles will continue to cross Foster Avenue between the 1 Foster and 2 Foster Avenue parcels. Construction vehicles will yield to road traffic. Sheet piles will be installed periodically to support excavation activities. The parking lot at 1 Foster Avenue is closed to the public.

The Green Trail along U.S. Avenue is closed in the vicinity of the excavation work.


